

I trace my love of clay back to schooldays in Dorset under the tutelage of Steve Sheridan and the many Leach tradition influences that punctuated those formative years. Twenty years, spent in the army and in business, passed in a flash and in 2010 I returned to the wheel and to potting part-time at my home in Gloucestershire.

My work is wheel thrown and slab built and is tempered with influences of simple functional beauty. I love clean shapes, simple objects and utility and remain ever captivated by the transformation of clay where craft and science jostle in infinite possibility. The Throw Down has drastically broadened my appreciation for and anticipation of those possibilities.

Today I continue on the inexorable path of discovery as a potter. Although not yet a full time potter, I am tutoring at the New Brewery Arts Centre in Cirencester and continue to be an apprentice (poorly) with Paul Jessop at Barrington Pottery when time allows. I work from my studio at home where I am developing a range of functional domestic ware along with individual pieces and commissions from which I feel a style beginning to awaken.

The Great Pottery Throw Down will be on our screens again from November. The series has been filmed with the judges and technical expertise from Series 1: Kate Malone, Keith Brymer Jones, Kevin Millward

From the Council, Margaret Gardiner



This is my first letter as a CPA council member. I joined the council September 2015 but had only been to two meetings before personal health got in the way and I decided to have a hip replacement in the spring. I am now bionic and keen to take on everything I've been unable to do in the past few years.

My first priority was to get production help and I advertised for a pottery assistant/apprentice in Ceramic Review, Studio Pottery, Adopt a Potter and Anglian Potters website. Luckily, my first apprentice, Frauke Abel, helped me find a qualified German apprentice, Franzi, who came over for a month to throw and help me fire my small salt kiln culminating in Earth & Fire. Franzi talked to many young people there about the opportunity I was offering which resulted in a Brazilian potter

and a Lithuanian student coming to my workshop for a weeks' trial. I have had applications from Holland, Norway and America and have given one week trials with potentials from Slovenia, but sadly only a couple from the UK.

We all bemoan the loss of so many of our centres for Ceramics training in Britain, but perhaps help is at hand. During Ceramic Art York last weekend, I was particularly interested in the discussion between Lisa Hammond and Alex McErlain about current ceramic education and the setting up of a Ceramic School in Stoke, with a two year, full time course for 45 weeks of the year starting in 2017.

Ceramic Art York was very well presented and the standard high and varied. I have personally found the collaboration with The York Art Gallery and CoCA fascinating. I talked to Anthony Shaw within his collection, found an ancient pot of my own, purchased by Bill Ismay from my final year show at Harrow, displayed in the orange section and was heartened by realising how many people bought and donated pots for collections. The outcome of CAY is yet to be discovered but brownie points need to be awarded for efforts made by all.

Now I'm off to Holland for Keramisto and then back to London for Ceramics in the City. On the horizon is Oxford and the CPA AGM followed by the second year of Innovations in Cambridge. I am involved with this show as Peter Ward is keen to involve Anglian Potters. This year I am setting up a display of just ten members' selected works who will be sharing their experience of how Anglian Potters can support local interest in clay at all levels. Our volunteers will also be assisting in the show.

Not to be forgotten is our CPA 60th anniversary year in 2018. Since the last council meeting on 3 September we have formed a working group to address how to celebrate and mark this milestone and what events would be appropriate? Our new manager Toby would welcome ideas at: tobybrundin@gmail.com
